I know you all are with us. Thank you for your support.



Kucerak Family Boosts NYIWA to New Record

◆The New York International Wine Auction (NYIWA), one of the northeast's premier wine and food events held October 6 at the Turning Stone Resort • Casino, raised a record \$320,000—thanks in part to a generous donation from Paul Kucerak and his family.

This year was magical with a \$100,000 donation from the Kuceraks to the Fund-A-Need portion of the evening that will ultimately help fund vital and meaningful updates to Arc Herkimer residential homes that are not covered with government funding. The family challenged those who attended to match support upgrades to enhance home life for the individuals supported. The Central New York community has come to realize that people equate the top-notch events Arc Herkimer hosts with the excellence of the supports and services the nonprofit provides.

Kucerak also donated \$50,000 in 2017 for the Fund-A-Need portion of NYIWA to support Arc Park, a regional park that supports recreation for people of all abilities. Proceeds from NYIWA help Arc Herkimer to empower people with disabilities and enrich lives throughout the community.

HI Achieves Record Sales Growth

► Herkimer Industries (HI), a division of Arc Herkimer, which supports an integrated workforce of 150 people with and without disabilities, just had another banner year, setting a new record of over \$7.2 million in sales.

HI is the only assembly house for Stop the Bleed kits that are sold throughout the world. In 2017, Herkimer Industries achieved \$750,000 in total sales for the kits. In 2018, that grew to \$2.2 million, and the numbers continue to rise. To spread the word regarding these life-saving kits, the HI Sales team members made presentations to the School Safety Summit hosted by the Herkimer County School Safety Taskforce, the New York State Governor's office, and colleges and schools. Additionally, the products were added for procurement through the New York State Office of General Services Preferred Source Program-NYSID.

HI became a member of the Contract Packaging Association to assist in seeking potential customers who are looking for unique contract packaging and manufacturing abilities. In 2018, new packaging opportunities were secured with two new customers: 4C Inc., energy drink mixes, and Seed Sheets, personal gardening kits. HI is also in the process of becoming SQF (Safe Quality Food) certified. The Food Safety Certification requirements provide a rigorous system to manage food safety risks and provide safe products for use by companies in the food industry.

Career Connections Earns National Award

◆Career Connections, a division of Arc Herkimer, and Herkimer County Community College earned a national job placement award for the Project SEARCH program.

The award, presented at the Annual Project SEARCH Conference in Savannah, GA honored the organizations for their collaboration to secure 100 percent placement for the first class of interns for jobs in the community earning at least minimum wage. In 2019, the program is in its third year of collaboration between the nonprofit and college.

Project SEARCH is a 40-week intern program for young adults with disabilities, ages 18 to 34, with a sole objective and intensive focus on achieving competitive employment and maximum independence for each participant.

Nichols Makes a World of Difference

Staci Nichols, Career Connection's assistant director, had the distinct honor of being named as a Difference Maker! TIAA (Teachers Insurance and Annuity) 100 Honoree. One hundred individuals throughout the United States were recognized for their work in the nonprofit sector for making significant contributions in their communities and the world.

TIAA received over 4,000 submissions, and Nichols was selected. Each recipient represents an inspiring story that epitomizes what it means to be a difference maker. TIAA recognized each of the 100 honorees with a \$10,000 donation in their name to the nonprofit organization they support, totaling \$1 million in contributions. Nichols chose Arc Herkimer as the recipient!

The final Difference Maker 100 Honorees were selected by a panel of judges based on their impact, creativity, perseverance, and motive. Nichols was chosen for her work with young adults, aged 16 to 24, and her assistance in helping them to reach their goals and find jobs. She assisted with life tasks such as job searches, earning high-school equivalency diplomas, enrolling in college, and signing up their children for daycare.

Boosting Safety with New Buses & Cameras

Arc Herkimer's transportation bus fleet traveled 227,000 miles delivering individuals to and from programs, work, and school. Transportation Services also provided 30 charter runs for a variety of local businesses, villages, and private parties.

Five new buses were added to the fleet in July 2018 with the project partially funded through a federal grant funneled through the New York State Department of Transportation. Those buses allowed for the retirement of some older models that were pushing up the costs of maintenance.

Safety improved with the installation of camera units on each bus. This multi-year project was partially-funded with a grant from The Community Foundation of Herkimer and Oneida Counties, Inc. The cameras are invaluable to ensure safety for drivers and passengers. Passengers cannot always articulate situations they might encounter with other passengers. Review of incidents can help mitigate further issues. Additionally, the cameras are a tool for managers to utilize for training purposes to help evaluate driving skills.

To keep driver safety at the forefront and to reward best practices, drivers are recognized for their attendance, driving records, and teamwork. Drivers of the quarters included: Bob Sommer (1st and 2nd), Terry Fox (3rd), and Mike Faubert (4th). Bob Sommer was also named Driver of the Year.

Reunited Feels So Good

► Historic floods in Herkimer County damaged an Arc Herkimer house in Mohawk, and although residents were never in harm's way, it was decided to change their living situation as the home was bought through a buyout program for areas with persistent flooding.

Individuals were relocated to different homes while awaiting completion of a complex construction project of a home in Herkimer to meet each person's needs. Arc Herkimer residential staff worked diligently with contractors to create a safe and inviting new residence. The four individuals were reunited in 2018, adding a new roommate.

Everyone loves the new Central Avenue home. Maryellen said she loves living closer to downtown, where she can walk to shop and visit friends. Diane likes that she has a shorter bus ride to work. Barbie and Diane are enjoying their bedrooms. Ron is happy the group is back together. Eric likes how quiet his new neighborhood is, and cooking in his new kitchen.

Hosting Inaugural Wheelchair 5K Run Division

Arc Herkimer hosted its first Wheelchair Divison at the Heart & Sole Awareness 5K Run, which was a day-long community celebration at Arc Park, a unique recreational park that accommodates recreation for individuals of all ages and all abilities. The event also included a free Kids' Run, which was enjoyed by over 50 children.

Proceeds from the Heart & Sole 5K help support people with disabilities and unfunded and underfunded programs at Arc Herkimer. Cash awards were presented at a post-race ceremony to each top overall male and female 5K winner, with prizes given to the first male and female finishers in each division and medals to second and third place winners in various age groups, including 10 and under to 60 and over. The runners and wheelchair athletes also enjoyed raffles and prizes that included local dining and store certificates. KISS FM was on hand for music and live remote broadcast.

Spreading the Word to Stop the Bleed

◆Herkimer Industries, the employment division of Arc Herkimer, donated a Wall-Mounted Bleeding Control Station to Herkimer-Fulton-Hamilton-Otsego BOCES. The Bleeding Control Station was installed next to the Herkimer BOCES AED (automated external defibrillator) at the Career and Technical Education labs at the William E. Busacker Complex in Herkimer.

The American College of Surgeons Committee on Trauma (ACS COT) is leading this effort to save lives. The goal is to train everyone in the U.S. about what to do during a bleeding emergency. Herkimer Industries is proud to be the designated and primary kitting house for this national program.

As seen on 60-Minutes, NBC Nightly News, Dr. Oz and other notable shows, the kits can help prevent bleeding, the number one cause of death in trauma. Twenty percent of people who have died from traumatic injuries could have survived with quick bleeding control. Launched in October 2015, Stop the Bleed is a national awareness campaign and call to action. It is intended to cultivate grassroots efforts that encourage bystanders to become equipped and empowered to help in a bleeding emergency before professional help arrives.

Walmart Named Employer of Year

Career Connections, the employment division of Arc Herkimer, honored Walmart with the 2018 Employer of the Year Award. The award recognizes Walmart's outstanding commitment to providing employment opportunities for people with disabilities.

Walmart also received a 2018 Central New York Employment Recognition by the Central New York Office for People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) during National Disability Employment Awareness Month in October.

Walmart hired 13 individuals in 2017-18. The store staff promotes job advancement with a positive approach with both Career Connections staff and individuals with disabilities.

In 2018, with support of employers such as Walmart, Career Connections placed 107 individuals in jobs in the community. The STEPS (Supportive Training & Education - a Plan for Success) program supported 39 individuals in 2018. The program provided volunteer and work experience designed to assist individuals in identifying career goals/plans through community exploration.

The store has achieved several record sales periods, and provides area residents an alternative for shopping—one that offers great values. Merchandise includes new and gently used brand-name items.

Recovering the value of donated goods also allows Arc Herkimer to empower individuals through innovative services for employment, mental health, education, housing, and other programs. Through donations, the store encourages efficient use of resources and diverts recoverable usable items from the local landfill. The focus is on re-purposing and recycling which promotes environmental sustainability and provides green jobs.

Career Connections Offers Support for Mental Health and Substance Abuse

► Career Connections, a division of Arc Herkimer, began a new service to engage, empower, and employ people with mental health or substance abuse disorders. Adult Behavioral Health Home & Community Based Services (HCBS) help to improve an individual's quality of life by assisting in getting and keeping a job, getting into school and graduating, managing stress, and living independently. Services also help individuals to meet their recovery goals.

In order to receive services, individuals must undergo an assessment and have a comprehensive plan of care developed by a Care Manager. Various components are available in Herkimer, Oneida, and Otsego counties, and may include Education Support Services, Pre-vocational Services, Intensive Supported Employment, Ongoing Supported Employment, and Family Support and Training. Staff also assists in creating a wellness action plan.

In 2018, the program supported 10 individuals.

Tom Bergen Bowling Tournament Benefits Autism Program

■ As of 2019, the Bergen family of Little Falls has hosted three Tom Bergen Memorial Autism Awareness Bowling Tournaments each February to benefit the autism programs at Arc Herkimer.

Other activities during the tournament weekends included bake sales, prizes, 50-50 raffles, Chinese auctions, and t-shirts sales.

As of 2019, the Bergen family has raised \$9,000 to date in memory of their son, Tom, who was diagnosed with autism, and passed away unexpectedly in 2016. Tom loved to bowl, from youth bowling to his high school team to the Sunday mixed league. He also was very active in his community and church. He was a member of Boy Scout Troop #31 and was awarded the rank of Eagle Scout. He also served as assistant scoutmaster.

Tom graduated from Mohawk Valley Community College. He enjoyed volunteering for Arc Herkimer for 16 years, and he was a true advocate for autism awareness. He was employed as a graphic designer at All Events Engraving, Little Falls.
