Dear Arc Herkimer Supporters:

There is not a way to adequately describe what 2020 represented at Arc Herkimer. The closure of our agency, due to the pandemic, had us reeling in a way we never thought possible. The world was turned on its ear and our industry was not sheltered from COVID's wrath. Many Arc's downstate began to lose people to the virus, those on staff, as well as individuals supported. It was a dark period early on.

Our industrial operations suffered greatly, in that, we lost half of our expected revenue, all directly related to the pandemic. Our programs were shut down, except for being able to provide service to the people who live in our residences. The impact to staff and people supported was significant, mostly from the aspect of feeling isolated with nowhere to turn.

We survived the year, but unfortunately, were hit with the wave of COVID affecting upstate New York near the end of 2020. Although we ultimately got it under control, it was not without our own loss. Fortunately, our numbers were very limited.

As we emerged from 2020, the hope of a better new year brought optimism. We continue that path knowing that our agency responds well to crisis and is ready to reposition ourselves for a better tomorrow.

Regardless of the difficulties encountered in 2020, look through the annual report and see the happy faces of people continuing to live their lives through tremendous adversity, unable to even leave their homes. We continued to enrich every individual we touched throughout the year.

Finally, we would not have survived the year had it not been for our front-line workers who worked diligently to care for and provide the best possible support to the people in our residences and other programs. Our heartfelt gratitude to all who put themselves in harm's way for the betterment of all individuals served. They truly were, and are, our local heroes.

The 40-week Project SEARCH® partnership with Herkimer College has an intensive focus on achieving competitive employment and maximum independence for each participant. Each intern participates in daily classroom instruction and gains hands-on work experience by rotating among three unique unpaid internships throughout the academic year. Skills learned by the interns assist in their search for employment.

# Day Habilitation Programs Re-Open Safely After Four Months of Quarantine Restrictions

After receiving direction from the Office for People with Developmental Disabilities to close congregate day programming in the middle of March, Arc Herkimer re-opened the agency's day programming on July 22nd.




# Agency Receives Unprecedented \$1 Million Donation to Replace Event Tent with New Venue at MV Golf & Event Center
